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OUR MISSION

Grace Prison Ministries Mission Statement in fulfilling the twofold mission of the "Great Commission" (Matthew 28:19-20) is as follows:

1. **EVANGELISM** - This includes winning the unsaved that are incarcerated but not limited to the saving knowledge of Jesus Christ through:

- a) The presentation of the simple gospel message of faith alone in Christ alone for salvation to those incarcerated and abroad.
- b) We will make the gospel as clear as possible, relying on the convicting ministry of the Holy Spirit, and leaving the decision to believe or reject to the individual.
- c) We will use no gimmicks to win people to Christ.

2. **EDIFICATION** - Bring to spiritual maturity those who have put their faith in Jesus Christ for salvation by teaching them the Word of God so that they too can function as part of the body of Christ in furthering evangelism and edification. We do this in the following manner as God provides:

- a) We provide Bibles as God provides to those who don't have one.
- b) We teach sound doctrine in the prisons, in a local church setting, and through prison conferences.
- c) We provide resources like Biblical books, recorded and written lessons.
- d) We direct the believer to a local church upon release from prison.

In conjunction with these two primary missions, we also have the following objectives:

EQUIPPING - Start Bible Institutes in prisons providing resources for training, so the serious students of the Word of God can be trained for local church service and missionary work abroad especially in the prisons.

Assisting the needy as God provides and directs us - This may include but is not limited to:

- a) Provision of food
- b) Provision of clothing
- c) Transportation




Any time we tune out the messages God has sent us, we put at peril not only ourselves, but also those around us. How important it is that we never turn off God's saving communication!

It was apparent that the inmates were hungry for truth. Friday evening and all day Saturday into the evening the inmates learned about the plan of God. They were taking notes and asking many questions. Several of them took the teachers aside during the breaks to ask more questions. One inmate named John was seeking a better understanding of the idea of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ's descent into Hades after His death on the cross.

Jim Austin showed him in his Bible where Abraham's bosom (paradise) is shown next to the place of torments in (Luke 16:19-31) which helped John better understand Acts 2:27 quoting Psalm 16:10. SCENES FROM OPERATION IMPACT LIVES





In the Christian life there is no standing still. We are either advancing to the high ground of spiritual maturity or we are going backwards. Believers in Jesus Christ are either progressing spiritually or regressing spiritually.



The Christian life is a spiritual life. It is spiritual because it is a life influenced by the Holy Spirit instead of our old sin-nature, and it is a life influenced by the Word of God instead of

Satan's viewpoint about life.

The term "backsliding" is a word used in the Old Testament to mean a "turning away from". It speaks of someone who was close but chose to turn their back and walk away from God. Most of the time it is because of sin that one turns away from God or the commitment they once had. Other times it is because of success which often times causes us not to see our need of God. Let's take King Solomon for example. Solomon began His reign as a man who loved God and valued the will of God above all else. There was no compromising Biblical truth with Solomon. There was no greater thing to Solomon than making sure God was pleased. He followed the Lord closely as his father David had charged him earlier to do.

David's Charge to Solomon-1 Kings 2:1-4

When the time drew near for David to die, he gave a charge to Solomon his son. "I am about to go the way of all the earth," he said. "So be strong, act like a man, and observe what the LORD your God requires: **Walk in obedience to Him, and keep his decrees and commands, His laws and regulations,** as written in the Law of Moses. Do this so that you may prosper in all you do and wherever you go and that the LORD may keep his promise to me: **'If your descendants watch how they live, and if they walk faithfully before Me with all their heart and soul, you will never fail to have a successor on the throne of Israel.'**"

Solomon's Love for God

"Solomon loved the LORD, walking in the statutes of David his father." One night, the Lord appeared to Solomon and said, "Ask what I shall give you" (verse 5). In response, Solomon answered, "Give your servant therefore an understanding mind to govern your people, that I may discern between good and evil, for who is able to govern this your great people?" (Verse 9)

The passage notes, "It pleased the Lord that Solomon had asked this" (1 Kings 3:10). God delights to give wisdom to those

who truly seek it (Proverbs 2:6-8; James 1:5). God responds to Solomon's request for wisdom by promising three different gifts. The first is the wisdom Solomon had asked for: "I now do according to your word. Behold, I give you a wise and discerning mind, so that none like you has been before you and none like you shall arise after you" (verse 12).

1 Kings 4:29-34 records the details of Solomon's wisdom: "And God gave Solomon wisdom and understanding beyond measure, and breadth of mind like the sand on the seashore, so that Solomon's wisdom surpassed the wisdom of all the people of the east and all the wisdom of Egypt. For he was wiser than all other men, wiser than Ethan the Ezrahite, and Heman, Calcol, and Darda, the sons of Mahol, and his fame was in all the surrounding nations. He also spoke 3,000 proverbs, and his songs were 1,005. He spoke of trees, from the cedar that is in Lebanon to the hyssop that grows out of the wall. He spoke also of beasts, and of birds, and of reptiles, and of fish. And people of all nations came to hear the wisdom of Solomon, and came from all the kings of the earth, who had heard of his wisdom."

The second gift God gave Solomon was wealth and fame: "I give you also what you have not asked, both riches and honor, so that no other king shall compare with you, all your days" (1 Kings 3:13). Solomon would become known as the wealthiest king of his era.

The third gift God gave him was conditional—a long life based on Solomon's obedience: "And if you will walk in My ways, keeping My statutes and My commandments, as your father David walked, then I will lengthen your days" (1 Kings 3:14). After God made these promises, "Solomon awoke, and behold, it was a dream" (verse 15).

The first two gifts were unconditional. Solomon was known as a man of great wisdom (1 Kings 3:28) and as a king of great wealth and influence. But was Solomon known as an obedient king who experienced a long life? By the grace of God, Solomon reigned for 40 years (1 Kings 11:42), a long period for one king to reign. However, Solomon's obedience was mixed. He had many wives, including foreigners who influenced him to sacrifice to their gods. His great wealth also contributed to unwise excesses. Solomon began well, as his humble request for wisdom shows, but he later disobeyed God. Solomon was spared more severe punishment for the sake of his father, David (1 Kings 11:11-12). The Book of Ecclesiastes is a record of Solomon's backsliding life from his own account of life without God. All he found was Emptiness!

Every Christian must examine himself on a regular basis for warning signs of backsliding or departing from his commitment to Christ. Most of us start the Christian life well but certain



things cause us to turn away from God and go backwards in the Christian life. Just like King Solomon, our focus can change progressively from God and His will to the things of this world and sin.

Remember, Solomon walked in God's word, he built a temple, he was giving wisdom, and he wrote scripture yet sin caused him to turn away from God. He went from God focused to self focused.

What were some of His errors?

- Solomon sinned but waited long periods of time before he would confess his sins to God and recover fellowship with God.
- God's word became less important with all the distractions.
- Solomon sought power.
- He compromised Biblical principles through his need for pleasure.
- He became tolerant of idolatry and sin.
- He became more concerned about himself than about God and his responsibility to the people to set a Godly example.

What are some of our errors?

- Sins of the tongue, sins of the mind, and overt sins
- Seeking to please ourselves rather than God
- Seeking to please people rather than God
- Being too concerned about relationships that build our confidence in ourselves rather than seeking God to develop our confidence in Him so we may know ourselves in Him
- Our lust for power and influence
- Our tolerance of idolatry and sin in our midst
- Our rejection or neglect of serious time meditating on God's word
- Loving pleasure more than lovers of God
- Worried about too many things including money to pay our bills
- Close association with people who do not share God's viewpoint about life and how his people should live
- Self confidence instead of showing our dependence on God through prayer and the study of His Word...the Spirit is willing but our flesh is Weak!

My beloved in Christ, every day we are either building character or we are weakening in our character. We are going

forward to maturity or backwards to our old unbelieving lifestyle before we got saved. The Bible tells us that: "The backsliding in heart will have his fill of his own ways, but the good man will be satisfied with his". (Proverbs 14:14)

The fact of God's people turning their backs on Him is nothing new (Hosea 11:7) but God always promises blessing and reward if we will turn back. Our country, The United States of America, is a backsliding nation because many believers are backsliding in their walk with God. In order for things to turn around we must do our part in our individual spiritual lives or we are in trouble. Listen to the words that Jesus gave the Ephesus church in Revelation 2. I think it has a secondary application for us today in the Church Age.

"I know your deeds and your toil and perseverance, and that you cannot tolerate evil men, and you put to the test those who call themselves apostles, and they are not, and you found them to be false; and you have perseverance and have endured for My name's sake, and have not grown weary. **But I have *this* against you, that you have left your first love.** Therefore remember from where you have fallen, and repent and do the deeds you did at first; or else I am coming to you and will remove your lamp stand out of its place—unless you repent. (Revelation 2:1-5)

I remember when I first got saved. I was so in love with the Lord and His Word was my rule in all things. Association with those who did not share God's viewpoint was unheard of in my life. I didn't worry about how my needs were going to be met. I had complete confidence that if I put God first and did His will everything would fall in place. But over time I became distracted with the details of life and sin. God has been so gracious to me and my love for Him is there but every day is a battle to stay committed to Christ, His word, and the service He has called me to. It is my prayer that everyone who took the time to read this charge will examine their lives and priorities and let's return with all of our hearts to the Lord! Returning to Him means:

- Habitually confess sins when you fail.
- Pray more.
- Study the Bible more.
- Attend a Bible church more.
- Do not compromise! The Word of God has the final authority in all matters of faith and practice.
- Doing God's will as He reveals it in His Word is more important than our pleasures.
- Maintain holiness of life through application of God's Word.
- Be careful about close association with those who don't share God's viewpoint about life.
- Be more concerned about pleasing God instead of people.

"If My people who are called by My name humble themselves and pray and seek My face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, will forgive their sins and heal their land." (2 Chronicles 7:14)



As a "GRACE MINISTRY" Grace Prison Ministries doesn't plead, beg or even ask people to donate to us. We depend upon God to move others to support the ministry as they see fit. However, unlike more visible ministries such as churches or disaster relief ministries, our efforts are often unseen except by the prisoners which are our focus. Therefore it's necessary to outline our needs which explain how donations are used.

Travel up and down the South and East Coast by car and air uses a tremendous amount of funds. Mailings take a good bit of funding. Also just general maintenance of the ministry, office space, funding prison conferences (team travel and food, food for inmates, conference material), study bible purchases. Keithian's household expenses funded by his salary are also major expenditures. Printing publications take funding as well.

We must always remember God's Word in 1 Timothy 5:18: It is just as the Scriptures say, "Don't muzzle an ox when you are using it to grind grain." You also know the saying, "Workers are worth their pay."

Should God lead you to help in the funding of this ministry please note it is tax exempt which means you can deduct contributions given to it. Also, note there is no waste associated with maintaining Grace Prison Ministries. 100% of the donations go to getting the Word of God to those in prisons and jails, which is their only hope of leading productive lives.
